While you are marking Sept. 2 on your calendar, mark Sept. 25 as well. Stratford will host their Harvest Fair and auction which will feature wagon rides, live music, bake sale, candle dipping, living history, broom making, puppet show, a farmer's market and much more. The cost is \$6 for adults and \$4 for kids.
